Facilities and Activities

The clubhouse lies at Earl's Eye on the river Dee and the Club House entrance is next to 4 Sandy Lane. There is a bar which is open every Tuesday and Thursday evening throughout the season and social events are held throughout the year. It is also the centre for canoeing training and the facilities include storage racks for canoes, changing rooms with hot showers and floodlights for extending canoeing practice. Thursday is canoeing club night and on Tuesday time trial sessions are held.

Dinghy racing takes place from the Dinghy Park further down Sandy Lane where there is a training room and changing area with hot showers. Space on the park is limited to 80 boats and if room is short, priority is given to active members. During the sailing season racing is organised on Sunday mornings and Tuesday evenings and members can compete for a number of series cups, regattas and special events. The racing programme is set out in the Club Handbook and all experienced sailors take a turn at officiating.

The club has a mixed fleet and currently recognises the following classes: Comet, Enterprise, GP 14, Graduate, Laser, Topper plus the Handicap Fleet. Some classes hold Open Meetings during the season.

The club is fully affiliated to both the BCU and the RYA. We are registered by the RYA for junior training dinghy sailing to Stage 4, adult dinghy training to Level 3 and power boating to Level 2, which are run in the summer. The canoe section runs beginner's classes for adults and juniors.

Applications

Applicants for membership should either use web collect or complete this paper form and send it to together with any payments, to the Hon Treasurer. Membership is formally accepted at club committee meetings which are held monthly. Until your acceptance is received from the Membership Secretary, intending members are welcome to attend as guests.

Out Of Port Membership

Is only available with the permission of the General Committee. In order to qualify you have to be resident 30+ miles from the club and not active on the water. The rate is 50% of the membership fee for your age group (Senior, Under 23, Junior)

General Conditions of Membership

- a) All members must agree to abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Club.
- b) Continued membership depends on payment of an annual subscription which becomes due on the 1st January each year.
- c) Each dinghy must have a valid Third Party Insurance with a minimum cover of £3M.
- d) **All sailors must wear an approved buoyancy aid whenever they are on the water.**

3rd Party Insurance cover

The Club requires that all members' dinghies intend to be used from club facilities are covered by a minimum of 3rd party liability insurance cover. Canoeists are covered by the club BCU membership. Dinghy owners may be asked to provide proof of valid insurance by a club officer.
